## Office Order

- A. The credit marks, for Social Outreach, Discipline & Extra Curriculum Activities (SODECA/DECA) subject, shall be awarded as per the following (for B.Tech/B.Arch/B.Design/MBA/MCA/M.Tech):
  - Minimum Passing Marks are not required for the subject, so no candidate should be declared fail in SODECA/DECA.
  - For courses/semesters having grading system, the minimum grade in SODECA/DECA subject will be the next higher grade from "F Grade".
- B. In continuation to COE Office order no. F(26)/BTU/COE/EXAM/2019-20/788-798 dated 17-09-19, a new point R-17.3 is added as follows:

"In special cases, where any student get "F" Grade in Total Marks in any subject and he/she is eligible for grace marks, then the grade of the subject will be converted from "F" Grade to "P" Grade (in case of Theory Subject) and "F" grade to "B" Grade (in Practical Subject), While if a student gets above "F" grade in total component marks of the subject, then his/her grade will not be changed."

- C. In the table no. 10.1 of Office order no. BTU/ F(26)/CBCS/2019/806-812 dated 19-09-19, it is noted that:
  - "If the percentage of a student with maximum marks in a subject / paper is in the fraction, then it would be appropriate in the interest of the students to consider his/her percentage as pre-whole number. (Example 89.67% would be 89%)"
- D. In the point no. 10 of Office order no. BTU/ F(26)/CBCS/2019/806-812 dated 19-09-19, it is noted that:

"For those students whose "Examination Result Evaluation Method" is based on "Relative Marking System", the "Topper Student" will be selected "Brance wise" for the third semester onwards. Whereas for the I/ II semester the "Topper Student" will be selected "Subject Wise" because all subject are common in I/II Semester."

### OFFICE ORDER

As per resolution of 2nd Academic Council Agenda No. 2.12 held on 12-07-2019 and subsequent approval of Board of Management (BoM) in its 3rd meeting held on 23-08-2019 vide resolution no 3.5, the regulations for choice based credit scheme for undergraduate degree (B. Tech) courses in engineering & technology have been adopted with partial modification (at Point No. 10 regarding Pass Rules Only) of office order BTU/F(26)/CBCS/2019/265-66 dated 14-02-19 issued for B. Tech (4 Yr. Program) under CBCS scheme w.e.f. academic session 2019-20.

1. Bikaner Technical University has implemented the Model Curriculum proposed by AICTE for Undergraduate Degree Courses in Engineering & Technology.

#### 2. Definition of Credit:

1 Hour Lecture (L) per week	1 credit
1 Hour Tutorial (T) per week	1 credit
1 Hour Practical (P) per week	0.5 credit
2 Hour Practical (Lab)/week	1 credit

#### 3. General Rules of Credits:

- a. A credit of 166 will be required for a student to be eligible to get Undergraduate Degree in Engineering & Technology.
- b. A Credit of 125 (166-41) will be required for a student ot be eligible to get Undergraduate Degree in Engineering & Technology admitted through Lateral Entry (LEEP) in 2018-19 and onward.
- c. A Student will be eligible to get B. Tech (Honours) Degree, if he/she completes an additional 20 credits. These credits should be acquired through MOOCs only.
- d. The structure of the degree will be as follow:

### 10. Pass Rules for B. Tech(4 Year Program):

The result of a candidate will be worked out at the end of each Semester Examination. The absolute marks of a student (pi) shall be converted into relative marks (xi) on 100 point scale as below:

$$x_i = \frac{p_i}{p_{max}} q$$

Where,

 $x_1$  = Converted relative marks of an individual student in a particular i<sup>th</sup> subject/course (rounded off to next higher integer number).

 $\mathbf{p_i} = \mathbf{Absolute}$  percentage (%) of marks obtained by an individual student in the i<sup>th</sup> subject/course.

 $\mathbf{p_{max}}$  = Value of  $\mathbf{p_{max}}$  will be determined from the range of highest absolute percentage (%) marks obtained in a subject/paper by a candidate in place of absolute highest marks obtained in a subject/paper. The range of absolute percentage is shown in the table below:

- 10.2 For a pass, candidate must obtain at least grade E for each theory and practical.
- 10.3 No grace marks shall be awarded.
- 10.4 If a student remains "Absent" or obtain "Zero" marks in any of external component of theory or practical, he/she will be awarded "F" grade, respectively and will be required to appear in the subsequent back examinations. "F" grade student while applying for back paper examination, may opt either of the following options:
  - A. Wish to carry forward the previous marks of internal assessment.
  - B. Wish to improve the internal assessment too.
- 10.5 Revaluation and inspection of answer books system will prevail as per existing examination regulations. However, change of grade point of individual candidate after the revaluation will be independent and shall not affect the grade point of other students
- 10.6 For a back examinee the grade and grade point of a particular subject/paper shall be calculated on the basis of his/her appearance in present (appearing) examination.

#### 12. OVERALL CGPA:

Where,

 $CGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{m} c_i \times p_i}{\sum_{i=1}^{m} c_i}$ 

C<sub>i</sub> = Number of credits of the i<sup>th</sup> course of semester

 $P_i$  = Grade point obtained in  $i^{th}$  course. A grade, lower than 'E' (i.e. grade point < 4) in a course shall not be taken into account.

i = 1,2,.....n represent the number of courses in which a student is registered and obtained a grade not lower than 'E' up to that semester for which CGPA is to be calculated.

- The overall CGPA shall be awarded after earning the required credits by the student for passing the said semester; otherwise it shall be awarded on passing all the semesters.
- SGPA/CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal digits on higher side.
- Final course merit will be decided on the basis of CGPA obtained by an individual student considering relevant merit ordinance of the university. Revaluation result will be counted for deciding the merit.
